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WIN Attitudes to Gender Equality Survey – Headlines Ireland

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After two years of the COVID-19 pandemic and remote working for many, women are less convinced in 2021 that gender equality has been achieved at home. Violence and sexual harassment remain a problem in Ireland, with 1 in 10 women overall and 1 in 4 women under 34 having experienced sexual harassment in the past year.

3 Just 1 in 3 women (34%) feel they have equal or more opportunities than men, whereas men are significantly more likely to believe they do have the same /better opportunities (57%).




Compared to the rest of the world, women in Ireland and less likely to feel they have the same of better opportunities than seen in many countries, and fall behind both the UK and USA

After 2 years of COVID-19 pandemic, we see significant decline in women who feel gender equality has been achieved at home

Broad decline in perceived equality at home since 2020

However, we see agreement is highest with regard to gender equality at home, followed by work and politics. Younger ages agreement has broadly declined in all three areas, which suggests they hold less traditional views and are open to change.



1 in 4 of 18-34 year old women have experienced sexual harassment in the past year




Sexual harassment amongst younger women has grown slightly since 2019, but remains lower **versus 2018**




Nearly 1 in 10 women in Ireland claim to have suffered violence or sexual harassment in the past year

This is more prevalent amongst younger ages, and especially so amongst younger women.


Incidence of Violence in past year (either physical or psychological)



Majority of women feel they have less opportunities than men



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
Where does Ireland stand globally in its views of gender equality?


Level of violence in Ireland is below the global average



Sample and Methodology

Methodology:

The WWS (WIN Worldwide Survey) is a study conducted every year with the purpose to measure people's thoughts, expectations, worries and perceptions related to relevant topics for society and business.

Sample Size and Mode of Field Work:

A total of 33,236 people were interviewed globally. See below for sample details. The fieldwork was conducted during October 2021 – December 2021. The margin of error for the survey is between 2.4 and 4.4 at 95% confidence level.

The global average has been computed according to the share of the covered adult population of the surveyed countries.
